

## **A Brief History of Crosspoint Church**

### **1996**

- Summer of 1996 - Information and Interest meetings
- August, 1996 - Bible Study led by Don Brown, Director of Missions, Collin Baptist Association. Sponsorship of a new church secured by First Baptist McKinney and seven other churches in Collin County and the Baptist General Convention of Texas
- September, 1996 - Weekly worship began the second Sunday in September 1996 at La Cima Ranch on Hwy 380 in McKinney. Seventeen families commit to starting the new church. Kaydee Adams was the first believer baptized.
- November, 1996 - Twelve acres of land purchased on Stonebridge Drive.  
Cost: \$500,000
- December, 1996 - Weekly Worship and Bible Study moved to Glen Oaks Elementary

### **1997**

- March, 1997 - Mark Turman called as pastor.
- July, 1997 - Kirk Davis becomes 1<sup>st</sup> worship leader.
- September, 1997 - Church's First Anniversary. Average worship attendance 113

### **1998**

- April, 1998 - David Adams becomes 1<sup>st</sup> minister to students.
- August, 1998 - HH Architects hire to begin Master planning facilities for the church.
- September, 1998 - Second Anniversary of Crosspoint. Average attendance 143
- December, 1998 – “Grow in Grace, Give in Faith, Build the Bridge” campaign. Sixty-five families commit \$1.2 million to begin Phase 1 Facility.

### **1999**

- April, 1999 – Church approves construction of 21,000 square foot Phase 1 Building at the cost of \$2.85 million.
- June, 1999 – Construction of Phase 1 begins by HH Architects of Plano and Pogue Construction of McKinney.
- August, 1999 – Name of the church changed from Stonebridge Drive Baptist church to Crosspoint Church.
- September, 1999 – Third Anniversary of Crosspoint. Average attendance 201.
- December, 1999 – Church approves purchase of additional eight acres of land adjacent to the current property for \$300,000. Total land holdings – twenty acres.

## **2000**

- May 14, 2000 – 525 people attended the first service in the new Phase 1 Facility.
- September 10, 2000 – Crosspoint Church's Fourth Anniversary. Vision and Dedication for the new facility. Average attendance 335.

## **2001**

- January, 2001 – Crosspoint Clubhouse Mother's Day Out and Preschool launched.
- September 11, 2001 – New York/Washington, D.C. Terrorists attack on U.S.A. Crosspoint experiences a 2-3 year period of decline and struggle.

## **2002-2006**

- May 1, 2002 – Next Step Campaign. \$625,000 in 3 year commitments.
- July 2003-David Monroe Hired as Minister of Youth
- March 1, 2004 – A second Bible Fellowship hour was started to accommodate renewed growth.
- September 2, 2005 – Crosspoint becomes a temporary shelter for Hurricane Katrina Evacuees.
- October 1, 2005 – Imagine 9.11.11 Long Range Planning process begins.
- September, 2006-10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Crosspoint. Average Attendance-417 HeartWorks 2011 5 year Vision launched to reach 1000 people in weekly average attendance and spiritual development by September 2011. OurPlace.Now campaign raises approximately \$300,000 for the addition of temporary space.

## **2007**

- August, 2007, Leah Newman hired as the 1<sup>st</sup> full time Preschool/Children's Minister.
- October, 2007 6,000 square feet of modular space added for Bible Fellowship growth.
